## E-waste made easy

E-waste refers to any waste with a plug, battery or cord that is no longer working or wanted.

It includes electronic items like computers/laptops and any related products like monitors, hard drives, mice and keyboards, cables, cameras, clock radios, electronic games/toys, grooming devices, juicers, televisions, DVD players and VCR players, and mp3 players, iPods and iPads.

## Why does disposing of e-waste correctly matter so much?

E-waste is growing three times faster than any other type of waste and the hazardous elements that it contains are harmful to us and our environment, so it's very important that we dispose of it correctly.

We recycle our e-waste to:

- Reduce landfill
- Protect the air and waterways from harmful materials
- Minimise consumption of raw materials to make electronic products
- Reduce greenhouse gases emitted when making those products



## So, where do I take my e-waste?

We want to make disposing of your e-waste as easy and convenient as we can.

You can take e-waste items to the Penrith Community Recycling Centre (CRC) year round\* for free or to one of Council's e-waste drop-off events.
