
We are growing our knowledge and skills.

Residents of Jordan Springs who completed Year 12 (or equivalent)



65% of people aged 15+ have completed Year 12 (or equivalent qualification), compared with 48% in the Penrith City LGA.

Residents of Jordan Springs who obtained a University qualification



30% of people in Jordan Springs have a university qualification (Bachelor degree or higher) compared with 17% in the Penrith City LGA.
