 Council understands people in our community are doing it tough in lockdown. If you, or anyone you know in a suburb of concern needs support with food, Council's Hamper Hub can assist.

Our 'Drive and Collect' Hamper Hub in North St Marys opened on Thursday, 2 September 2021 as part of Council's COVID-19 response strategy. It provides emergency food hampers for families and individuals who are struggling to access groceries.

This service is being coordinated by Council and delivered in partnership with FoodBank, Westcare and Community Junction, with support from volunteer group Turbans 4 Australia. The friendly staff from Council's Ripples team are operating the hub every Tuesday to Thursday.

Bookings are essential and can be made via 0406 528 331. For those unable to leave home, staff can help with other support options.

 Penrith City Council has developed a new online interactive map to showcase the ongoing revitalisation of the Nepean River, and help residents and visitors discover all the things to see and do there.
