




# Llandilo

Suburb




**Llandilo is a rural suburb that contributes significantly to Penrith's agricultural production. It is known for the rural character and scenic landscapes, that still allows for easy access to the broad range of services and facilities available in the Penrith City Centre.**

**Llandilo has a resilient community, in recent years this community has experienced and recovered from significant impacts of flooding.**

**The residents of Llandilo are an ageing community and are very family orientated. Residents mainly live in separate houses, a high proportion of which are fully owned. Of those who rent, a significant proportion experience rental stress.**

**Llandilo residents are culturally diverse with many people speaking a language other than English at home.**








# Our population


The population of Llandilo has remained stable since 2016.




# Health

Llandilo residents in need of assistance due to disability




Llandilo residents with at least one long-term health condition



# Housing


Separate house



Medium density




High density



# Housing

Most people in Llandilo own their own home, outright or with a mortgage. A much higher proportion of people in Llandilo (47%) fully own their home compared with the Penrith City LGA (24%). No one in Llandilo rents social housing.

Many people have mortgage and rental payments that exceed 30% of their income, an indicator of housing stress.





# Education

Completed Year 12 (or equivalent)

Llandilo



48% of residents in the wider Penrith City LGA have completed Year 12 or equivalent (2021).

In Llandilo, more people than ever have completed Year 12 or have a university qualification. However, the proportion of people who have completed Year 12 or have a university qualification is significantly lower than that of the wider Penrith City LGA.


