
Suburb



Cranebrook is an older established suburb of Penrith LGA. With rural lands to its north, Western Sydney Lakes to its west, and views to the Blue Mountains escarpment, the suburb today is a mixture of rural and urban areas. Cranebrook also exhibits a diversity of residents, with a number of different communities residing in the suburb.

The community of Cranebrook is changing and will continue to change into the future. Currently, residents of Cranebrook predominantly live in separate houses, with high levels of home ownership. There is a growing number of people who rent both private and social housing.












Health

Residents in need of assistance due to disability




Residents with at least one long-term health condition




Separate house



Medium density




High density


Housing stress

Many people have mortgage and rental payments that exceed 30% of their income, an indicator of housing stress.




More people than ever are completing Year 12 and getting a university degree.




Cranebrook is transforming.
