Panel Consideration

The Panel had regard to the assessment report prepared by Council staff, supporting plans and information, and the following environmental planning instruments and policies:

- State Environmental Planning Policy (Biodiversity & Conservation) 2021
- State Environmental Planning Policy (Resilience and Hazards) 2021
- Penrith Local Environmental Plan 2010
- Penrith Development Control Plan 2014

In terms of considering community views, the Panel noted there were zero (0) submissions received in response to the public notification of the Development Application.

Panel Decision

In accordance with Section 4.16 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979, DA24/1013, Installation of Scoreboard & Viewing Platform at Parker Street Reserve 49b Glebe Place, PENRITH, NSW, 2750, be approved subject to the recommended conditions of consent accompanying the assessment report.


Reasons for the Decision

- The Panel agreed with the assessment of the proposal outlined within the Council's assessment report.
- The assessment of the development application has been the subject of an independent peer review by an external town planning consultant in accordance with Section 66A of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation and Council's adopted 'Managing Conflict of Interest for Council Related Development Policy'. This peer review concludes that the assessment and conclusions are well founded, and the resulting development proposal is supportable subject to recommended conditions of consent. The Panel agrees with this conclusion.
- The location of the structure does not impede significant view corridors or result in adverse visual impact for surrounding properties, subject to recommended conditions of consent relating to hours of operation and signage.

- Appropriate conditions have been recommended to ensure the proposed development and associated works will have minimal environmental impacts.
- The site is considered to be suitable for the proposal and is in the public interest, by providing infrastructure associated with recreational sporting activities for the local community.
